4.1	Coating shall withstand the test described in 5.2.	Pass	
	The surfaces of and coatings on parts of the barbecue coming into contact with the food to be barbecued, cooking grid, split, meat forks and gravy trays, see Directive 89/109/EEC. Different legal requirements can exist in non-EU countries.	N/T

4.2	Requirements for parts:	
	Cooking grid	
4.2.1	The clear distance between the bars of the cooking grid shall not exceed 20mm before, during and after tested according to 5.2 and 5.6. This requirement relates to the usable area of the gird, which shall be at least 60% of the horizontal area of the fuel compartment vertically projected. If the cooking grid has the function of a grate, the clear distance between the bars of the grate and also, in the case of vertical fuel compartment, of those between the grate and the edges of the fuel container shall not exceed 20mm before, during and after tested according to 5.2 and 5.6. The cooking grid shall rest on its supporting points in the most unfavorable position when loaded as specified in 5.5. When the load has been removed the deformation of each grid shall not exceed 5% relative to the length of the bar when tested according to 5.6. Manually adjustable cooking grids up to 400 mm diameter or longest side measurement shall be fitted with one handle minimum, cooking grid sover 400 mm diameter or the longest side measurement shall be fitted with two handles. If the cooking grid position can be adjustable, this adjustment shall be possible without the operator's hand coming into direct contact with the cooking grid in such a way that tipping to the side or forwards when loaded as specified in 5.5 shall be impossible. No handle is required when the height of the cooking grid can be adjusted through a mechanical device. The barbecue shall be designed in such a way that when the fuel compartment is uniformly loaded to 75% of its capacity, the cooking grid in its most unfavorable position shall not come into contact with the fuel. 4.2.2	Spit	
	The end of the spit shall have the shape of a truncated cone of minimum diameter not less than 1.5 mm and not exceeding 3 mm and a taper angle between 60 degree and 90 degree. The spit shall have a permanent or removable handle of at least 100mm usable length. The handle for any motor supplied with it shall be 80mm minimum length. If the distance between the support points of the spit exceeds 800mm, a second handle shall be provided unless the motor has the function of a second handle. The handle (or handles) shall be fitted in such a way that when tested as specified in 5.2, the surface temperatures shall not exceed the values in Table 3. The spit shall have a minimum of two adjustable and fastenable meat forks. When loaded the spit with 0.5 Kg per 100 mm usable length it shall rest on all its supporting points. The other components of the barbecue shall not come into contact with a cylinder 200mm in diameter, with a grid in place, and of a length equivalent to at least 60% of the usable spit length placed centrally around the spit and in the center of the spit. If several points are possible, this requirement shall be met for at least one position.	N/A
