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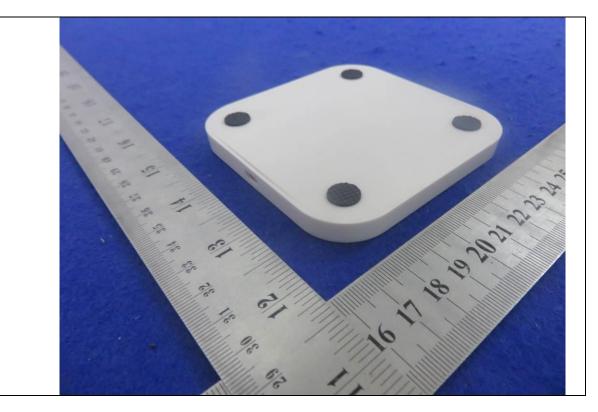


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Details of: External view-1

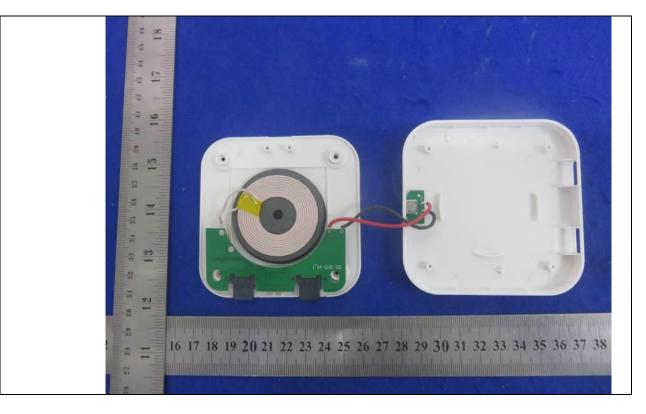


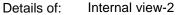

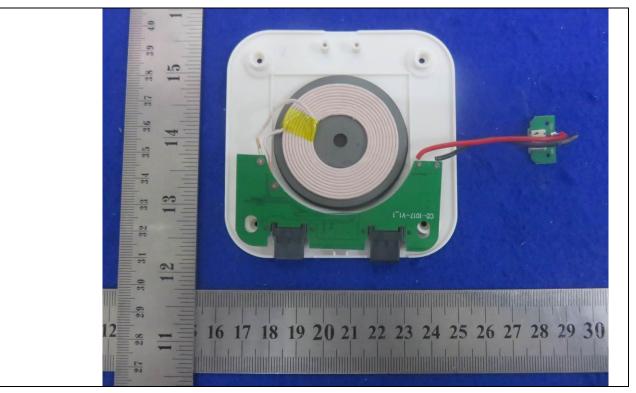


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Details of: Internal view-1





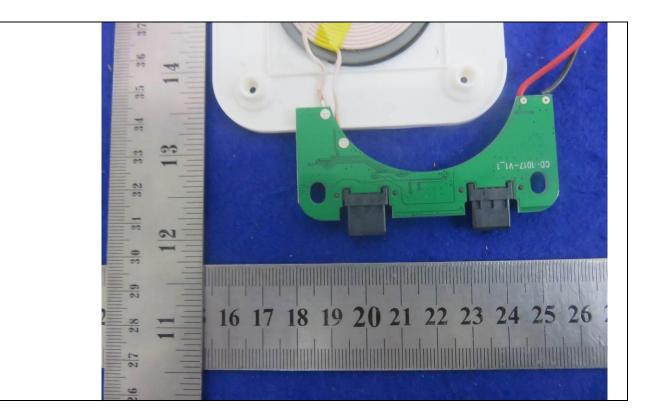


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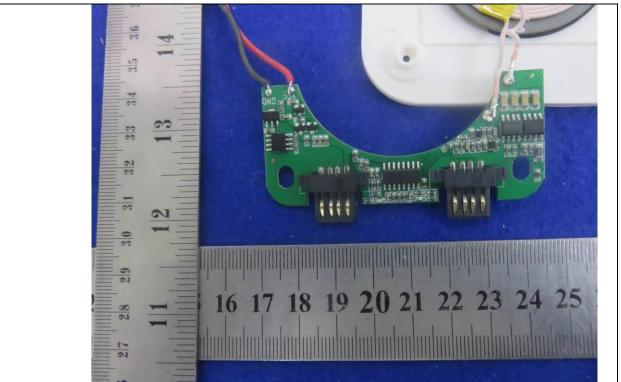
